The true man Jesus Christ had a very tough life as a preacher here on earth. He felt pain, agony, and extreme human struggle and sacrifice. Scripture is clear that when He was feeling down, Jesus would go to a quiet place to pray. Jesus would go and silently appeal and appear to the ear of His Father in prayer. The account from Luke 11 is descriptive of His disciples noticing that when Jesus would return from these moments of quiet with His Father that He would do so refreshed and full of a new comfort and peace. From this observation comes the question, "Lord, teach us to pray." The disciples, full of their own stresses and discomforts, sought the same gift they saw Jesus receiving. Financial Aid/Global Studies

Our enrollment and re-enrollment processes for the 2012-2013 academic year are in full swing. The first round of financial aid allocations were mailed this past Tuesday. The second round of financial aid allocations are being processed and will be finalized as a group in mid-May. If you intend to apply for financial aid for the coming school year, please do so through [TADS](#) as soon as possible.

Every family seeking financial aid is being afforded the opportunity to be considered to serve as a host family for one or more "Global Studies Students." Information regarding this was included as a part of the final financial aid award letters that were sent to families. Any interested family is potentially eligible to qualify for service as a host family with initial consideration being given to families seeking tuition assistance. Host families

receive a monthly stipend of \$900.00 and various support services from Mr. Wingfield within the "Global Studies" department. We have had several families express interest and welcome additional inquiries. Please let us know directly if you are interested in serving in this meaningful way for your own family, that of a new student to our country, and the body of Christ as more students are brought before His Word by way of our school ministry. Lake Country Lutheran HS is looking for a *Vocal Coach/Instructor* for the 2012/2013 school year. This person would give private voice lessons to students from LCL during the school day. The number of students would vary from semester to semester and from year to year.

This person should be trained in classical vocal technique and literature, but also be able

to coach students in Broadway literature. One of the major responsibilities is to prepare private students for Solo & Ensemble Contest, for solo work, as well as ensemble work. Piano skills are a necessity.

Another important aspect of this coach's position is to support the Choral Director by reinforcing skills taught in the classroom, i.e. proper breathing technique, vertical vowel production, basic music theory skills and expression of literature.

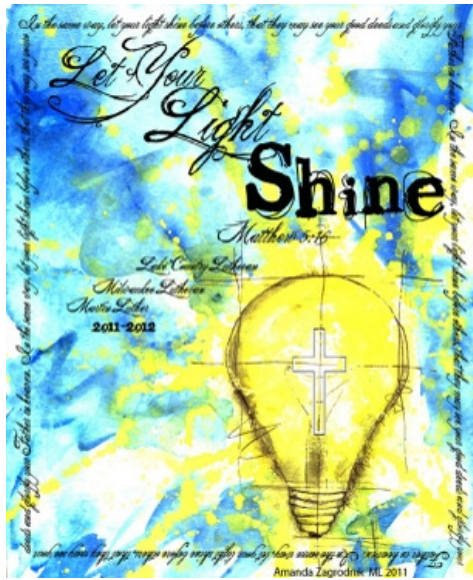
